PUSHCART PRIZES FOR 2012 EDITION



The editorial board of the *Pushcart Prizes: Best of the Small Presses* has announced that the international literary magazine *New Letters* has won a rare two awards for work published in 2010. An essay by the famed poet and essayist B. H. Fairchild, called “Logophilia,” will join a short story called “Rockaway,” by the up-and-coming literary talent Lydia Conklin. Both works first appeared in the summer 2010 edition of *New Letters* and will be reprinted in *The Pushcart Prizes: XXXVI* (2012).

Writing nominated for the Pushcart Prizes comes from editors and editorial board members nationwide, and includes thousands of works each year. Other writers from the 2010 issues of *New Letters* nominated for the Pushcart Prize include Rose Bunch, Mariko Nagai, Gary Soto, Dorthé Nors, Kerry James Evans, Gary Gildner, Siobhan Fallon, Robin Hemley, Michael Downs, Robert Day, Chad McCracken, and Cynthia Lewis.

Pushcart Prize XXXVI is edited by Bill Henderson with a national network of Pushcart-Prize editors, published by Pushcart Press and distributed by W.W. Norton Inc., New York, N.Y.
